On Saturday, September 30, 2023, twentynine Scholars spent four hours touring the Norfolk FBI Field Office. The day started with Scholars receiving a lecture on the history of the FBI by Special Agent in Charge, **Brian Dugan**. Scholars also received a lecture on federal Civil Rights law and enforcement, the various jobs that are available in the FBI, internship opportunities and summer camps.

The day ended with Scholars receiving interactive demonstrations and lectures from the bomb squad and evidence recovery team. Scholars expressed that this experience created positive interaction between Black male youth and law enforcement that was beneficial towards bridging gaps in trust and increasing interest in considering a career in the FBI.


